SCRUTINY FOR 37 TYUI, 38 WOKHA, 39 SANIS AND 40 BHANDARI HELD

Scrutiny for four constituencies under Wokha district was held on 29th May 2018 at DC's conference hall, Wokha in presence of Observer Ravinder Singh, ARO Dr.ManazirJeelaniSamoon, AEO AketoShohe, Youth Wing-NPF, Wokha Division, Media Secretary-NDPP and DPRO N.Stephen Ngullie.

The agents of candidates were apprised about the scrutiny process in detail. The scrutiny was undertaken Assembly Constituencies-wise starting with 37-Tyui followed by 38-Wokha, 39-Sanis & 40 Bhandari AC. There were few general verbal complaints received from political parties regarding some incident in 38-Wokha AC during voting on 28/5/18. These complaints were enquired upon by Sector Magistrates and found to be baseless. The entire poll process happened peacefully without any incident of violence. No complaint about polling has been received on Samadhan, or reported in the local media as on 29/5/2018.

Record (including Presiding Officers dairy, sector Magistrates reports, Micro-observers reports, video recordings) of polling stations which had registered complaints & voting percentages of 5%+/- (from average, since average turnout being high & range being narrow) polling including from 17 A was carried out by the ARO in the presence of the Observer. However the polling stations with minimum percentage of voting as compared to AC average were also scrutinized and no anomaly was found. No abnormality which could vitiate was noticed in the report.

No complaint or issue was raised by the agents about the poll during scrutiny. Hence it is concluded that entire process was peaceful and normal in the Assembly Segments & no repoll is required anywhere in 37, 38, 39 and 40 ACs of Wokha district.

DISRUPTION OF WATER SUPPLY TO PHEK TOWN HQ

Executive Engineer, PHED Phek, Er. T. Imtiakum has informed that the water supply to Phek town Hq. will be disrupted for indefinite period as the main pipeline of 100mm DiaGi Pipes are damaged on 20th May 2018 at several locations between Muchuri and Laka source, Ketsapo village by landslides and mudslides due to incessant rainfall. In some locations the vehicle is inaccessible to transport pipes and materials for repairing works due to blockade of road to the damaged site.

The Executive Engineer PHED Phek has requested the consumers of Phek Town Hq. to bear the inconvenience caused until repair work is completed for restoration of normal water supply.

SUSPECTED OUTBREAK OF MEASLES IN ZUNHEBOTO: OUTBREAK IS UNDER CONTROL

Suspected outbreak of measles has been reported from Aghunato Block, Zunheboto According to the data provided by DPO(RCH and UIP) Zunheboto, Dr.AlemwabangAier,a total of 50 cases have been identified from areas of Aghunato town, Shevishe and Lukikhe as on 28thMay.

In this respect the relevant blood,urine samples and throat swap have been collected and sent for laboratory testing. Measles is a highly infectious and deadly disease among children which is easily preventable by vaccination.

However the immunization coverage has remained below 50% in the district. Health department with the help of district administration is running an immunization drive under special Intensive Mission Indradhanush and also making efforts to improve Routine Immunization Coverage for pregnant mothers and children below 5 Years of age.

The district administration, through press release, has appealed to all the concerned citizens to give full support and ensure that no child is left behind from life-saving vaccines

NLSA REFRESHER TRAINING FOR PANEL LAWYERS UNDERWAY

The two-day Refresher Training for Panel Lawyers by the Nagaland State Legal Services Authority (NLSA) is underway at Administrative Training Institute on 29th and 30th May 2018.

Delivering the inaugural address, Justice L.S. Jamir, Judge Gauhati High Court & Executive Chairman NLSA said that the responsibility is more cast on the Panel Lawyers of Legal Services than other lawyers under any institution, to understand the problem of the underprivileged, the needy and the downtrodden. He therefore urged the Panel Lawyer to work hard while preparing for cases.

He implored the Panel Lawyers of Legal Services not to accept any gifts from people while rendering free Legal Aid. He also advised to resolve issues amicably, in case of misunderstandings over cases among the Panel Lawyers.

He further appraised that the Refresher Training for Panel Lawyers is targeted at various aspects, particularly the various schemes under the National Legal Services Authority and other laws. He congratulated the Member Secretary NSLSA for covering wide range of topics during the two-day training.

Delivering the keynote address, Mezivolu T. Therieh NJS, Member Secretary NSLSA appriased that the two-day refresher training for Panel Layer is organised to increase the capacity of the panel lawyers in order to render complete and quality legal services. She said that Panel lawyers play an indispensable role in carrying out the activities of the Legal Services Authority as they act a catalyst between the people and the law.

Therefore, “Quality trainings for better performance cannot be overlooked in order to achieve the objectives of access to justice”, she said. Mezivolu T. Therieh said Legal Services Missions have been carried by the energetic and enthusiastic efforts of the panel lawyers for which immense response have been drawn from the cross section of the society. She further reminded that the Legal Services institution have a challenging task ahead with the programmes of Legal Services Camps, Legal Literacy Clubs, Artificial intelligence, Victim Compensation schemes, issues of human trafficking, Rights of Women and Children, LokAdalats, jails and other related programmes focusing from legal awareness towards legal empowerment.

The Member Secretary underscored on the need to come together and build up strategies and programmes so that not only the legally underprivileged but the socially and economically underprivileged section of the society benefits from their services.

The gathering was enthralled through Special Number “Sob KeInsafDibo” by Kohima District Legal Services Authority. The programme was chaired by Neite-o Koza, Panel Lawyer NSLSA & Incharge Jail. This was followed by two sessions dwelling on NALSA Schemes, various projects and programmes of NSLSA and government schemes. Panel Lawyers from all the district of Nagaland were present at the training.
